THIS WEEK'S LESSON: HELMET OF SALVATION



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

One of the most vital parts of any suit of armor is the one that protects our head. The helmet covers our heads in battle; the salvation that comes only from Jesus, protects us completely and makes us strong in him. Luke 23:31-43, The Crucifixion



HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

How do your kids use safety gear to play outside? Review with them the importance of things like knee pads, elbow pads, and especially bike helmets. Ask them how salvation is like a helmet, protecting us from sin.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What does the helmet represent in the armor of God?
- What did Jesus do to give us salvation?
- How can we receive the gift of salvation?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"So put on all of God's armor. Evil days will come. But you will be able to stand up to anything. And after you have done everything you can, you will still be standing."

Ephesians 6:13 (NirV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

Salvation means we are saved. It means the enemy can tempt us and distract us but it cannot destroy us. We are forgiven, and we are bound for paradise. Pray that your children will accept God's gift of salvation and give their hearts to Jesus.
